



FY22 VEC Participation Report to the Governor's Workforce Board

In FY22, 179 young adults were in the VEC program

- 57.0% are still actively participating in VEC on 6/30/22 (N=102)
- 43.0% have transitioned out of the VEC program during FY22 due to turning 21 years of age (N=77)

Data Notes:

- The number of VEC participants in the Fiscal Year is an unduplicated count. A young adult could leave and re-enter the VEC program during the Fiscal Year, that is not reflected in the data.
- Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, young adults in the VEC program were allowed to stay in the program past their 21st birthday and were not closed out until 9/30/21

Additional Data on the 102 participants actively participating in VEC on 6/30/22

Demographics (Age):

- 3.9% of active VEC participants were 18 years of age on 6/30/22 (N=4)
- 20.6% of active VEC participants were 19 years of age on 6/30/22 (N=21)
- 41.2% of active VEC participants were 20 years of age (N=42)
- 34.3% of active VEC participants were 21 years of age on 6/30/22 (N=35)

Education & Employment:

- 10.8% of active VEC participants were enrolled in a High School or GED program on 6/30/22 (N=11)
- 19.6% of active VEC participants were enrolled in post-secondary education on 6/30/22 (N=20)
- 4.9% of active VEC participants had a post-secondary degree or credential on 6/30/22 (N=5)
- 63.7% of active VEC participants were employed full-time, part-time, and/or has multiple jobs on 6/30/22 (N=65)
- 44.1% of active VEC participants were enrolled in more than one thing on 6/30/22 (i.e., Employed, Enrolled in School, Enrolled in Vocational Program) (N=45)

WIOA & Workforce Training Programs:

- 75.5% of active VEC participants had completed a career assessment by 6/30/22 (N=77)
- 6.9% of active VEC participants were enrolled in Youth WIOA programming on 6/30/22 (N=7)
- 0.0% of active VEC participants were enrolled in Adult WIOA programming on 6/30/22 (N=0)
- 6.9% of active VEC participants were enrolled in a workforce training program on 6/30/22 (N=7)

Data Notes:

- All VEC participants were prompted to complete a vocational assessment upon entry into the VEC program. However, some participants did not need to enter the academic and career pathway or may have refused to complete the assessment
- 2 of the VEC participants in a workforce training program enrolled on their own without a referral through the VEC Career Pathway
- The percentage of young adults enrolled in education or employed is not mutually exclusive, VEC participants will be counted in both categories.
- Most VEC Participants are enrolled in more than one thing during their participation in the program (i.e., Employed, Enrolled in School, Enrolled in Vocational Program)
