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# **Overview of RFP**


## **Topic 1**



The path between the K-12 education system, the postsecondary education, and the workforce is like a relay race. It is frequently hard to hand off the baton between systems, leading to gaps, which is a major obstacle to students' success in college and career.



PrepareRI creates a connected and aligned system for college and career readiness, with supports to reengage opportunity youth that get disconnected from the system.



## **Objectives**



Statewide Intermediary Role:

Build out, maintain & support an online platform using a domain provided by the GWB

Promote the platform (and the intermediary's services) among groups of stakeholders


Act as a concierge/coordinator for schools & CBO's that wish to pursue opportunities offered by employers & respond to gen. questions & inquiries

# **Eligibility and Funding**



## Who is Eligible to Apply?

- Strong K-12 school engagement
- Strong employer engagement
- Working knowledge of career exploration, WBL & academic readiness efforts
- Strong administrative & fiscal capacity

## What Funding is Available?

- The total available funding for Year 1 of this effort (July 1, 2024 June 30, 2025) is \$300,000.
- One (1) awardee will be identified through this competitive solicitation/RFP process.
- The award is subject to the availability of funds and the execution of a contract between the selected recipient and the GWB.

# **Major Project Elements**

# **Scope of Work**



- 1) K-12 Schools and Youth-Serving Community-Based Organizations (CBOs): The platform will provide a mechanism for K-12 schools and youth-serving CBOs to identify high-quality career exploration, work-based learning, and academic readiness opportunities for students/youth.
- 2) Employers and Other Industry Organizations: The platform and intermediary will provide a vehicle for employers, industry associations, and other organizations to efficiently and equitably connect with K-12 schools and youth-serving CBOs to offer high-quality career exploration and work-based learning opportunities.

Priority #3: Academic Readiness	Incorporate and help promote Academic Readiness opportunities associated with PrepareRI and other state initiatives and partners as appropriate.	Low

# **Performance Milestones (Year 1)**

July 1, 2024-December 31, 2024	<ul> <li>Consult with educators, CBOs, and employers to determine how to make the online platform and intermediary services as user-friendly as possible.</li> <li>Build out the online platform with input from the PrepareRI Core Team.</li> <li>Inventory existing PrepareRI programs with the PrepareRI Core Team to serve as initial content for the online platform.</li> <li>Begin cultivating career exploration opportunities through outreach to organizations and employers.</li> </ul>
January 1, 2025	Online platform goes live and is ready for the online submission of opportunities from employers and other organizations as well as requests/inquiries from schools and CBOs.
January 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026	<ul> <li>Actively promote the platform and the intermediary's services among the following stakeholders with an eye towards equity and high-priority occupational areas with input from the PrepareRI Core Team:         <ul> <li>K-12 schools and youth-serving CBOs (targeting educators, counselors, and administrators)</li> <li>Employers and Industry Associations</li> <li>Organizations offering high-quality career exploration/work-based learning opportunities.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

# **Ongoing Engagement**



## \*The goal over time is to have ALL schools and CBOs educated on the existence of this platform\*

## • K-12 Schools and Youth-Serving Community-Based Organizations (CBOs)

- Coordinate with the PrepareRI Core Team to disseminate information on the platform to K-12 schools and youth-serving CBOs.
- Present to key stakeholder groups such as the Governor's Workforce Board, the Rhode Island Superintendents'
   Association, the Rhode Island League of Cities and Towns, etc.
- Directly engage with educators and counselors from a minimum of <u>2</u> K-12 schools and <u>2</u> youth-serving CBOs every month through either in-person or virtual sessions.

## Employers and Other Industry Organizations

- Engage with a minimum of <u>2</u> industry associations or Chambers of Commerce each month to explain and promote the platform.
- Directly engage with a minimum of <u>2</u> employers each month, especially those in high-priority industries to promote the platform and cultivate high-quality opportunities.
- Work with the PrepareRI Core Team to identify and outreach to other organizations offering high-quality career exploration and work-based learning opportunities.

## **Budget & Budget Narrative:**

- Brief description of each budget item and what role the item will play in the execution of the grant in your budget narrative (See Appendix A)
- Your proposed budget for how you plan on allocating these funds (See Appendix A)

## **Other Documents:**

- Taxation Letter of Good Standing: The applicant must submit a current Letter of Good Standing from the State Division of Taxation. If this letter is not available in time for proposal submission, the applicant may submit proof of request.
- **Fiscal Agent Assurances Form:** (See Appendix B) for the required form. This form is signed by the applicant to affirm that they will comply with all applicable regulations, policies, guidelines, and requirements of the GWB and the State of Rhode Island and have the fiscal capacity to administer the grant.
- Copy of Applicant W-9 Taxation Form: (See Appendix C) Downloadable online

# **Evaluation & Selection Process**

## **Evaluation and Selection**



- GWB staff will perform an initial screening of applications to ensure that submission requirements were met, and all required sections were included. An Evaluation Committee consisting of members of the PrepareRI Core Team (example: RIDE, RIOPC, and GWB) will review and score proposals.
- If necessary, oral presentation of the proposal may be required to clarify content in the proposed plan.
- Final selection of the award recipient will be at the discretion of the GWB Executive Director in consideration of the recommendations made by the Evaluation Committee.

All proposals must be submitted in PDF format, electronically, to <u>Julissa.Disu@dlt.ri.gov</u> by May 20, 2024 no later than 4:00pm, EST.

The Budget, Budget Narrative, and other attachments must be either contained within the primary PDF or included in the same e-mail as separate attachments if needed.
